Job Summary: A Parks Laborer is responsible for the upkeep and maintenance of public parks and recreational areas. Their primary duty is to ensure that these outdoor spaces are clean, safe, and enjoyable for visitors.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Grounds Maintenance: Perform routine maintenance tasks such as mowing, trimming, and removing weeds to keep the park's landscape in good condition.
- Trash and Litter Removal: Collect and dispose of trash and litter from various areas within the park, including picnic areas, playgrounds, and walking trails.
- Facility Maintenance: Inspect, clean, and maintain park facilities such as restrooms, pavilions, and benches. Make minor repairs as needed.

Environmental Conditions: Work is performed in a typical outside environment. The worker may be exposed to temperatures in excess of 100 degrees for more than one-hour, chemical hazards, and high dust environments.
